Year 9 WIN students from Hayesfield Girls School had the opportunity to visit the University of West of England on the 4th December, for a Cyber Security day.

Activities included becoming a crime scene detective and solving a murder mystery using code breaking techniques, lock picking, virtual reality and a workshop run by the South West Regional Cyber Crime Unit, helping students make informed decisions when moving forward with their cyber learning. OfS support NCOP's for a further 2 years

In December, the OfS officially confirmed that it would be supporting the NCOP programme for a further two years; 2019 / 20 and 2020 / 21 academic years.

NCOP partnerships will continue to deliver targeted HE outreach to young people in Year 9 upwards, in the areas where they have the greatest impact.


However, with an extended remit, the NCOP will also support 'Outreach Hubs' within the existing partnerships, who between them will provide coverage for every Local Authority in England. These hubs will help teachers and advisors find out about outreach activity available in their area; pro-actively support schools and colleges in areas of low participation to access HE outreach; and provide a platform for other local collaborative activity.

Final funding for the two years will be confirmed April / May 19.
