WHAT IS HIGHER LEVEL STUDY?


Higher Skill Map (you will need to sign in to use)

What is LABOUR MARKET INFORMATION?

Labour Market Information, or LMI for short, is data and research about the predicted current and future job market and the skills that will be needed to make sure the economy is healthy.

Lifepilot has National and Local Labour Market Information, you can also look at other websites for your <u>Local Authority</u> or <u>Local Enterprise Partnership</u>.

Labour Market Information on Lifepilot:

- ☐ Look at the job profiles to see if that job is growing
- ☐ In the <u>'Routes into a Growth Sector'</u> see what sectors are growing and routes into them.
