WHAT IS HIGHER LEVEL STUDY?



Higher education means any study from Level 4 (which is equivalent to the first year of a university course) upwards – this can include <u>a range of degrees</u>, <u>work-related courses</u> <u>and even postgraduate qualifications</u>.

You can start at any level on your routes to higher level study – see below.




CAREER TOOLS – The Higher Skills Map


What is LABOUR MARKET INFORMATION?

Labour Market Information, or LMI for short, is data and research about the predicted current and future job market and the skills that will be needed to make sure the economy is healthy.

Lifepilot has National and Local Labour Market Information, you can also look at other websites for your Local Authority or Local Enterprise Partnership.

Labour Market Information on Lifepilot:

- Look at the job profiles to see if that job is growing
- □ In the <u>'Routes into a Growth Sector'</u> see what sectors are growing and qualification you can take to get into them.
- In <u>'Retraining after Covid'</u> see what local support might be available to you and for which sectors.



The Sciences Good Study Guide (Northedge et al., 1997) advises that you should ask yourself these questions:

- What is the table about? The title of the table should tell you what it is about.
- Where has the information come from? The source of the information should be stated.
- What do the rows and columns represent? The labels for the rows and columns should tell you what they
 represent.
- What do you want to know? This will depend on your reasons for reading the table. You may want to look up
 a single piece of information, or you may be looking for overall patterns.
- What are you expected to remember? Tables often contain a great deal of information. You may not need to
 remember any of it. Usually, it's the overall trends that are important.
